WALT DISNEY WORLD ~ THEME PARKS OVERVIEW



Magic Kingdom

This park features various lands including Tomorrowland, Fantasyland, Liberty Square, Fronteirland, Adventureland, Main Street U.S.A., and is home to Cinderella Castle. You will find nostalgic rides here such as It's A Small World, Jungle Cruise, Dumbo's Flying Elephants, and thrill rides like Tron Lightcycle/Run, Space Mountain, Thunder Mountain Railroad, Seven Dwarfs Mine Train and many other classic rides and attractions! You'll have the opportunity to meet Mickey Mouse, Disney Princesses, Winnie the Pooh & Friends, and other beloved classic characters. Plus, here you will have the chance to catch various parades and cavalcades during the day and the night time fireworks spectacular "Happily Ever After".



EPCOT

This park is home to World Celebration, World Nature, World Discovery, and World Showcase. Featuring four international festivals throughout the year including the Festival of the Arts, Flower & Garden, Food and Wine, and the Festival of the Holidays. You will find rides here such as the iconic Spaceship Earth, Remy's Ratatouille Adventure, Test Track, Guardian's of the Galaxy: Cosmic Rewind, The Seas with Nemo & Friends, Frozen Ever After, Soarin' Around The World, and more! EPCOT offers a lot of Character meet and greet opportunities, great food and drinks, indoor and outdoor play areas, and so much more!



Disney's Hollywood Studios

This park features Hollywood Boulevard, Sunset Boulevard, Echo Lake, Animation Courtyard, Commissary Lane, Pixar Plaza, Grand Avenue, Star Wars: Galaxy's Edge, and Toy Story Land. You will find rides such as The Twilight Zone Tower of Terror, Rock 'n' Roller Coaster Starring Aerosmith, Toy Story Mania!, Slinky Dog Dash, Mickey & Minnie's Runaway Railway, Star Wars: Rise of the Resistance, and more. If you want to immerse yourself in the movies this is your park! Plus, don't miss the nighttime spectacular, Fantasmic!



Disney's Animal Kingdom Theme Park

This park is home to the Tree of Life and features areas such as Dinoland U.S.A., Asia, Africa, Oasis, Pandora - The World of Avatar, Discovery Island, and Rafiki's Planet Watch. Here you can view shows such as Festival of the Lion King and Finding Nemo: The Big Blue... and Beyond! and you can also catch rides such as Avatar Flight of Passage, Kilimanjaro Safaris, Expedition Everest - Legend of the Forbidden Mountain, Kali River Rapids, and more.

SHOULD YOU VISIT ALL 4 PARKS?

Should you visit all 4 Theme Parks? It depends on your group's interests and the length of your trip.

Can you visit all 4 Theme Parks in one or two days? Yes. Should you? Probably not.

Here's why...

If you truly want to experience what each park offers I highly recommend that you dedicate at least one full day to each park (with or without a midday break). A full week at Walt Disney World is the perfect amount of time to take it all in and also allows you to enjoy a few fun rest days at your Resort. However, if you are planning a shorter trip and want to experience the highlights of each park then there are options that are right for you too! While each theme park has its own unique features there may be one or two that fit your overall interests over the others.

Therefore, first, you will need to determin which Parks you want to visit....

WALT DISNEY WORLD ~ RESORT TYPES



VALUE

Value Resorts are typically the most affordable option, with rooms starting at around \$200 per night. They offer basic amenities, such as a pool, a fitness center, and a restaurant. Value resorts also offer free bus transportation to the theme parks.



MODERATE

Moderate Resorts offer more amenities than value resorts, such as a larger pool, a playground, and a variety of dining options. Rooms start at around \$300 per night. Moderate resorts also offer free transportation to the theme parks.



DELUXE

Deluxe Resorts offer the most luxurious accommodations, with rooms starting at around \$500 per night. They offer a variety of amenities, such as a spas and multiple restaurants. Deluxe resorts often offer other free forms of transportation to the theme parks aside from bus transportation.

GOOD NEIGHBOR HOTELS

Walt Disney World Good Neighbor Hotels are also conveniently located near the Walt Disney World Resort. These hotels have a partnership with Walt Disney World and offer comfort, quality, and great service.

A few of the Good Neighbor Hotels include the Walt Disney World Swan Hotel, Walt Disney World Dolphin Hotel, and Walt Disney World Swan Reserve which feature deluxe accommodations in the heart of Walt Disney World Resort—within walking distance of EPCOT, Disney's Hollywood Studios, and Disney's BoardWalk entertainment area.

The Four Seasons Orlando at Walt Disney World, located close to Magic Kingdom Park, offers a luxurious resort experience with many amazing amenities for the entire family.

There are also 7 Disney Springs Resort Area Hotels that provide guests with a range of lodging options—so one is sure to fit your budget and vacation needs.
